CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Dan Duncan, called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Barto made a motion to approve the July 23, 2024, Board of Trustees minutes and July 17, 2024, Finance Committee minutes as presented. Weaver seconded the motion and Barto, Duncan, Weaver and Joyce voted in favor of the motion. Dr. Green had not yet arrived.

2024 ORGANIZATIONAL SCORECARD REPORT

CEO Webber shared the star rating in each category. Performance of each pillar area was discussed. We currently have a 5-star rating in Outpatient Service and Growth.

ACCEPTANCE OF REPORTS FROM OFFICERS APPROVAL OF QUALITY ASSURANCE PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT (QAPI) REPORT

Necia Kimber shared the Clinical Performance Scorecard with the members. CMS approved new measures, which were highlighted on the scorecard and are being tracked. CMS has not yet determined the expected rate for these measures.

JULY/AUGUST 2024 FINANCIAL REPORT/SEPTEMBER FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Alan Lovelace provided a PowerPoint summary of operations for July and August 2024. In August, admissions, including rehab, were 427 below budget of 430, and above last year of 386. Average Daily Census, including rehab was 51, compared to a budget of 48 and last year of 48.

Surgeries were 473 for the month, below budget of 503 and above last year of 457. Surgeries at the Surgery Center West were 621, up from 540 in July, yet below last year of 643.

Emergency room visits were 2,896 above last year of 2,659, and up from July at 2,699. Outpatient visits, not including ER visits, were 14,817 above budget of 13,495. Clinic Visits were 24,185, above last year of 22,257. Births were 58 for the month, below July of 82 and above last year at 51.

Financial assistance was \$1.7M for the month. Salaries and Wages were at \$13.1M, above budget of \$12.1M, and last year of \$11.4M. FTE's were 1,574 below budget of 1,592. Benefits were \$3.2M above last year of \$2.7M.

Operating Income Consolidated is \$303,000, below last year of \$1.9M. Operating Income for the Hospitals is \$740,000 below last year of \$3.5M. Operating Income for Stillwater Medical is \$601,000, below last year of \$3.8M. Operating Income for Stillwater Medical Perry is \$24,000 compared to a budget of \$15,000 and last year of (\$416,000). Operating Income for Stillwater Medical Blackwell is \$115,000, above budget of \$72,000 and below last year of \$150,000. Operating Income for the Clinics is (\$437,000) compared to a budget of (\$732,000) and last year of (\$1.6).

Operating Income for the Hospitals year to date is \$9.8M compared to last year of \$11.0M. Operating Income for the Clinics year to date is (\$4.1M) compared to last year of (\$6.68M). Operating Margin for the Hospitals is 5.83% compared to last year of 7.28%. Operating Margin for the Clinics is -5.5% compared to a budget of -7.3% and last year -9.7%.

YTD Operating Margin Consolidated is 2.50%, compared to a budget of 2.81%. YTD Non-Operating Revenue is \$7.8M, below last year at \$9.2M. YTD Net Income Consolidated is \$13.6M, above last year of \$12.2M.

The BancFirst investment account increased to \$87.7M and year to date is 7.75%. The Arvest investment account increased to \$10.2M and year to date is 8.69%. The Commerce investment account increased to \$16.6M and year to date is 8.94%. Consolidated Investments for August is \$114.7M.

Days in Accounts Receivable is 37 days. Cash Collections-AR only for August was \$25.2M compared to \$23.1M in the 2nd quarter. Net AR Balance Consolidated was \$48.5M. Cash on Hand is \$127.8M compared to \$139M at year end 2023. Days Cash on Hand was 142 in August.

A YTD Operating Income Summary vs Budget and Investment Bank Performance was provided.

Lovelace shared that the Finance Committee reviewed the financials and summary of clinic operations. Commerce presented SMC's investment portfolio update.

SEPTEMBER 2024 FACILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT

Steven Taylor shared the Facilities Committee Report giving an update on all projects underway. The new ICU is open, and renovation has started in the previous ICU area. He noted that the parking lot is poured and will cure over the next three weeks. He let the members know that we will need to shut the water off to the building for approximately six hours to replace necessary valves. We are meeting to find the best day and time, and to determine all that is needed during the downtime, i.e. bottled water, hand washing stations, etc.

SEPTEMBER 2024 MEDICAL STAFF INTEGRATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Joe Ogle shared the Medical Staff Integration Committee report. He let the members know that the new Onboarding process has started and is working well. The Committee discussed possible consideration of adding Maternal Fetal Medicine services. The residency program is full, having 15 residents.

Joyce made a motion to accept the standing reports. Weaver seconded the motion, and Duncan, Weaver, Joyce, Green and Barto voted in favor of the motion.

CONSENT AGENDA

Dan Duncan updated the Board members on all Consent Agenda items for Stillwater Medical Center and Rural Emergency Hospitals in Blackwell and Perry. All actions listed on the consent agenda were approved through our Medical Staff Committees.

Joyce moved the Board approve the Consent Agenda. Weaver seconded the motion and Weaver, Joyce, Barto, Green and Duncan voted in favor of the motion.
