CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Dan Duncan, called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m. The members reviewed the Mission, Vision and Values statement included in the packet. The safety video was shared with the members.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Wilkinson made a motion to approve the April 22, 2025, Board of Trustees minutes, April 16, 2025, Finance Committee minutes, April 21, 2025, Medical Staff Integration Committee minutes and April 8, 2025, Facilities Committee minutes as presented. Weaver seconded the motion and Barto, Duncan, Weaver, Joyce, Wilkinson, Clark and Green voted in favor of the motion.

APPROVAL OF 2024 AUDIT REPORT

Andrew Castillo with D & Co., presented the 2024 Accountants' Report and Financial Statement (Audit Report). He shared the summarized financial results, as well as ratios and trends. Stillwater Medical compared favorably with hospitals in Oklahoma. He noted that Stillwater Medical exceeded other rural Oklahoma hospitals in Days Cash on Hand. A clean unmodified opinion was issued. No material adjustments were made. The report in detail was included in the Board packet and reviewed by the members.

Barto moved the Board approve the 2024 Audit Report as presented. Clark seconded the motion and Weaver, Duncan, Wilkinson, Barto, Joyce, Green and Clark voted in favor of the motion.

2025 ORGANIZATIONAL SCORECARD REPORT

CEO Webber shared that we are meeting or exceeding goal in inpatient, clinic, outpatient, quality, people and growth. Our overall performance rating is 3.15 stars.

ACCEPTANCE OF REPORTS FROM OFFICERS APPROVAL OF QUALITY ASSURANCE PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT (QAPI) REPORT

Steven Taylor shared the Clinical Data Base scorecard with the members. The quality team is attending the Medical Staff Sections meetings to discuss opportunities to improve quality and safety for our patients.

APRIL FINANCIAL REPORT/MAY FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Alan Lovelace, CFO, provided a PowerPoint summary of operations for April 2025. Admissions, including rehab, were 495, above last year of 415. Average Daily Census, including rehab was 63, compared to a budget of 68 and last year of 53. Surgeries were 476 for the month, below last year of 482. Surgeries at the Surgery Center West were 641, above last year of 593.

Emergency room visits were 2,879 above last year of 2,673. Outpatient visits, not including ER visits, were 15,974 above last year of 14,641. Adjusted patient days at SMC were 6,401, above last year of 5,973. Clinic Visits were 32,292 for the month, compared to a budget of 37,125 and last year of 33,750. Births were 64, below budget of 79 and last year at 89. The number of discharges from the NICU was 10 compared to a budget of 18.

Financial assistance was \$1.4M for the month. Salaries and Wages were at \$14.4M, above budget of \$13.1M, and last year of \$12.1M. FTE's were 1,706 above budget of 1,675 and last year of 1,551. Benefits were \$2.7M below budget of \$3.02M and last year of \$3.00M.

Operating Income Consolidated is \$1.17M, below last year of \$1.6M. Operating Income for the Hospitals is \$1.52M below budget of \$1.57M and last year of \$2.0M. Operating Income for Stillwater Medical is \$1.5M, above budget of \$1.4M and below last year of \$1.7M. Operating Income for Stillwater Medical Perry is \$64,000 compared to a budget of \$31,000 and last year of \$11,000. The operating Income for Stillwater Medical Blackwell is (\$110,000), below budget of \$130,000 and last year of \$214,000. Operating Income for the Clinics is (\$345,000) compared to a budget of (\$374,000) and last year of (\$383,000).

Operating Income for the Hospitals year to date is \$5.2M compared to a budget of \$4.4M and last year of \$3.8M. Operating Income for the Clinics year to date is (\$1.9M) compared to a budget of (\$2.2M) and last year of (\$2.4M). Operating Margin for the Hospitals is 6.38% compared to a budget of 5.29% and last year of 4.54%. Operating Margin for the Clinics is -4.6% compared to a budget of -5.1% and last year -6.7%.

YTD Operating Margin Consolidated is 2.73%, compared to a budget of 1.71% and last year of 1.19%. YTD Non-Operating Revenue is \$4.5M, above budget of \$980,000 and last year at (\$147,000). YTD Net Income Consolidated is \$7.9M, above budget of \$3.1M and last year of \$1.1M.

The BancFirst investment account decreased to \$66.24M and year to date is -0.07%. The Arvest investment account decreased to \$10.2M and year to date is -0.15%. The Commerce investment account increased to \$16.7M and year to date is 0.35%. Consolidated Investments for April is \$93.2M.

Cash Collections-AR only for April was \$29.0M compared to \$25.2M April 2024. Net AR Balance Consolidated was \$46.7M. Cash on hand is \$113.9 compared to \$134M at year end 2024. Days Cash on Hand was 116. A YTD Operating Income Summary vs Budget was provided.

Lovelace shared that the Finance Committee reviewed the financials and summary of clinic operations. BancFirst presented the investment portfolio. The Committee recommended approval of the 2024 Audit Report, Vocera System Replacement and the Financial Assistance/Charity Care policy changes.

Weaver made a motion to accept the standing reports. Clark seconded the motion, and Duncan, Joyce, Weaver, Wilkinson, Clark, Green and Barto voted in favor of the motion.

APPROVAL OF THE PURCHASE OF VOCERA SYSTEM REPLACEMENT

Alan Lovelace shared that the Vocera system is the wireless communication system staff use to communicate throughout our system. It was purchased in 2016 and is at end of life. The total cost of the project is \$271,169.79 of which \$200,000 was budgeted.

Barto made a motion to approve the purchase of the Vocera System Replacement at a total cost of \$271,169.79. Weaver seconded the motion, and Barto, Wilkinson, Green, Joyce, Clark, Duncan and Weaver voted in favor of the motion.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2025-02 (PURCHASE OF REAL ESTATE)

Steven Taylor shared that Stillwater Medical owns the property around the property for sale at 607 and 611 S. Orchard and it is within 250 yards of the main campus. The building was built in 2017 and is in good condition. Two tenants currently lease the building. The purchase price is \$3,007,000 (\$3.16 a square foot) with an ROI of 11 years. We are exploring financing options for several projects.

Barto made a motion to approve Resolution 2025-02. Joyce seconded the motion, and Joyce, Barto, Clark, Green, Duncan, Wilkinson and Weaver voted in favor of the motion.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2025-03

Brad Horst shared an adoption agreement provided by TIAA which allows an update to the plan. The members discussed the eight recommended changes in detail.

Webber shared that we are looking at plan administrators and the cost of doing so. Mayor Joyce pointed out that Section 12 excludes "elected members of the City Council" and recommended specifying Stillwater, as to not exclude Blackwell and Perry.

Clark made a motion to approve Resolution 2025-03 with the exclusion specifying Stillwater, Oklahoma in Section 12. Wilkinson seconded the motion, and Clark, Duncan, Green, Joyce, Barto, Weaver and Wilkinson voted in favor of the motion.

APPROVAL OF ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES

Webber shared that the Oklahoma Hospital Association members statewide would like the amount of charity care provided to be the same at all Oklahoma hospitals, the Promise to Oklahoma. These changes would make our financial guidelines the same as other Oklahoma hospitals.

The CMS Conditions of Participation (COPs) require that contracted agencies meet the same required COPs. A survey is done annually in effort to meet this requirement.

Barto made a motion to approve the Financial Assistance/Charity Care and the Contract Services policies as presented. Green seconded the motion, and Green, Joyce, Clark, Duncan, Weaver, Barto and Wilkinson voted in favor of the motion.
